The criteria for invitation were a combination of commitment and interest demonstrated towards the evaluative process, (giving priority to those who could not attend the first meeting and with whom we had worked only by e-mail), and strategic choices we made based on the stories, regarding the contents that we needed to clarify.

The workshops were facilitated by Claudia Fontes and the 'witness' or cultural expert who had accompanied the evaluation from the beginning in each country.
